Clima

is a project funded by the European Union and supported by the Italian Ministry for the Enviroment, Land and Sea. Clima is developed within the Asia-Link Programme, a programme dedicated to higher education networking between Europe and Asia. It aims to create a Euro-Asian network on Climate Change and Sustainable Development, to strengthen the community and to bridge the gap between science, policy making and practice.

The project responds to the need to enhance the technical and scientific capacities of young researchers and faculty, in order to understand and respond to the local impacts of global changes by promoting sustainable policies, procedures and practices.

Within the 3 years project, Clima has: ¬ trained 20 young researchers/faculty from the partner universities through 4 thematic workhop;

¬ developed research activity twinning the young beneficiaries work with the senior scientists/experts supervision; ¬ developed an on-line curriculum of post-graduate studies (Masters) for technical staff dealing with international regulations, national implementation and application of economic tools.

Presents the project outcomes to a larger public, with the aim of raising public awareness towards climate change through practices that can be performed by various stakeholders.

The conference includes speeches by high level experts from the countries involved as well as from international bodies, presentations and posters by the trainees on the research carried out within the project and a presentation of the master on-line developed within CLIMA.

A Stakeholders' Round Table is foreseen within the event to foster the relations between scientists and policy-makers.

Scientific Research

20 research papers have been developed on different climate change aspects by the trainees under the supervision of international experts. 4 of the research papers developed have been already published in international journals. The best papers will be presented at the final conference; posters will illustrate all papers developed within the project.

Curriculum Development

The four training Sessions have resulted in the development of course materials for an on-line curriculum of post-graduate studies on Climate Change management which will be jointly launched at the Final Conference.

Virtual Community

An international community, based on a platform on-line, has been established by the project and constitutes the basis for sharing knowledge, support collaboration and research on a cross national perspective.

Outcomes

- a set of original and innovative research outputs in the field of Climate Change Management;
- ¬ a curriculum for an on-line Master Program to be launched jointly by the 7 partners after the project;
- a web platform to support the Master Program and to disseminate the scientific project results to a wider academic and policy-making audience.
